110. PRAYERS

Prayers were given by the Mayor's Chaplain Reverend Brian McQuillen.

111. APOLOGIES

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Bryan, Martin and Welch with apologies for late arrival from Councillor Mrs Hannaford. Apologies were also received from Sergeant Hall – Devon and Cornwall Constabulary.

112. TO RECEIVE QUESTIONS OR STATEMENTS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Mr Clements from The Old Bridge House, Quay Road, West Looe asked the Council to endorse his request for Cornwall Council to change its policy on the observation time for loading/unloading bays from five minutes to ten minutes. Mr Clements stated that five minutes is not long enough for guests of accommodation providers, of which he is one, to load or unload, check in etc.

The Chairman proposed that Looe Town Council write a letter of support to the Chief Executive of Cornwall Council as requested by Mr Clements, the Council were in full agreement. Mr Clements also stated that his numerous reports of the water leakage underneath the bridge above the pathway on the West Looe side has still not been rectified and, in his opinion, has rendered the bridge unsafe be recorded.

Mr Clements also asked that his thanks to Councillor Mrs Hannaford and the Town Clerk for all their hard work and assistance be recorded.

There were no other questions from the Members of the public although they had all attended to listen to the debate of the Budget/Precept Proposals for 2011/12.

In order to accommodate the Members of the Public the Mayor asked Council's permission to alter the order of the Agenda to discuss Agenda No: 16 at this stage. Council were in full agreement.

113. TO RATIFY THE BUDGET/PRECEPT PROPOSALS FOR 2011/12 AS RECOMMENDED BY THE FINANCE AND WORKS COMMITTEE OF 8TH DECEMBER 2010

Councillor Smith, Chairman of the Finance and Works Committee, explained that the recommendation from the meeting of the 8th December 2010 had been to increase the precept for 2011/12 by 20%, however, he now felt it more prudent to reduce this increase to 15%. Following Cornwall Council's emergency budget last week it has become apparent that Town and Parish Councils will be asked to take on more services with no funding and in view of the possible capping of precepts next year 15% would be a sensible increase. Councillor Smith proposed that there be a 15% increase in the precept, seconded by Councillor Gregory who pointed out that this increase would suffice for 3/4 years. No vote was taken at this point.

Councillor Galipeau had provided information and Notice of Amendment (as attached Appendix 'A') and agreed that the Council has to take a responsible attitude and take account of services that will be devolved but argued that it also has a duty to look at the level of reserves held and to look at the risks on an annual basis. He considered that, in view of the current level of the reserve fund there should be no increase in the precept. Councillor Toms and Lambert stated that the monies ring-fenced for the PCSO and CCTV should be released to offset increases from devolved services, Councillor Gregory stated that both the PCSO and CCTV ongoing and the monies will be spent.

At this point Councillor Mrs Hannaford joined the meeting and apologised for late arrival having attended Lansallos Parish Council meeting.

There followed much further discussion about the level of Council reserves, devolved services with no funding, possible precept capping from 2012/13 etc with Councillor Mrs Hannaford highlighting the salt/grit bin service and possible closures of libraries and taking on the Bowling Club/Putting Green.

Councillor Smith agreed a review of expenditure could be undertaken and stating that costs such as salaries cannot be reduced but will not increase next year and, having listened to all arguments, suggested a 10% increase in the precept, review expenditure and possibly be able to decrease the precept next year.

The Mayor stated that we need to be clear what services we give to our residents, the Council's spending is very careful and prudent. He then asked for proposals for the level of increase of the Precept.

.1 Proposals for a 10% increase

Councillor Smith proposed an increase of 10% for 2011/12, seconded by Councillor Gregory it was agreed with a vote of 7/3 and 1 abstention.

Councillors Galipeau, Toms and Lambert requested it be recorded that their vote was against a 10% increase.

.2 Councillor Galipeau – Notice of Amendment (as attached) point 1.

Councillor Galipeau proposed that there be no increase in the precept for 2011/12, seconded by Councillor Lambert the vote was 3/5 against with 3 abstentions, the proposal was lost.

It was therefore:

RESOLVED

With a vote of 7/3 and 1 abstention to increase the precept for 2011/12 by 10%.

114. TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE LAST FULL COUNCIL MEETING

Councillor Mrs Hannaford proposed that the Minutes of the last Full Council meeting of 15th November 2010 be accepted, seconded by Councillor Hoskin it was:

Councillor Toms declared an interest in any matter raised concerning Cornwall Council and Looe Harbour Commission

Councillor Lambert declared an interest in any matter raised concerning Looe Development Trust.

.2 Prejudicial Interests

There were none declared.

116. TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM DEVON & CORNWALL CONSTABULARY

As Sergeant Hall had given his apologies the Clerk was asked to read out the report provided (see attached Appendix 'B'). Councillor Galipeau asked that the matter of the proposed closure of the Station Enquiry Office be referred to the Environment and Public Protection Committee, this was unanimously agreed.

Councillor Mrs Hannaford reported that a recent message left on the Police Station answer phone had not been answered for two days and asked for assurance that this will not happen again. The Mayor stated that this will be looked into.

117. TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM THE CORNWALL COUNCILLOR FOR WEST LOOE AND LANSALLOS

Councillor Mrs Hannaford gave her report as per attached Appendix 'C'.

Councillor Mrs Hannaford also highlighted access problems on Hannaford Road during the icy weather which is not gritted by Cornwall Council and proposed that Looe Town Council purchase a filled grit bin to be located near the top of Pennylands steps, seconded by Councillor Crane it was:

RESOLVED

With a vote of 10/1 abstention to purchase a filled grit bin to be located on Hannaford Road.

118. TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM THE CORNWALL COUNCILLOR FOR EAST LOOE AND ST MARTINS

Councillor Toms gave his report as follows:

.1 Cornwall Council Spending Review

Cornwall Council had to make a budget fit for purpose and some tough decisions had been made and good progress is being made.

.2 Salt Bins

A grit bin which is on a precautionary route can be moved to Shutta and Councillor Toms has asked for this to be done.

.3 Allotments

The land at Great Tree has been cleared and marked out and all the allotments are now being used. An allotment association has been set up with a Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer having been elected. Councillor Toms thanked the landowner for all his help.

.4 Local Traders Meeting – Reference Fore Street Roadworks

Ms Hicks, Chief Executive of Looe Harbour Commission, has agreed to meet with local traders to explain the difficulties of access along the Quay.

.5 Police Station Enquiry Office

Councillor Toms expressed regret at the loss of this facility but stated that it is more important to keep the current level of police staff.

.6 “Be a good neighbour” flyer

Councillor Toms had shown this to officers at Cornwall Council who had been most impressed at Looe Town Council’s initiative.

.7 Malcolm Bell – Tourism Officer

Councillor Toms had attended a recent meeting, there is £200k available for Tourist Information Centre’s and bids can be made.

This matter was referred to the Town Tourism Committee.

.8 Adult Health

As a result of the loss of Looe’s NHS dentist on 1st December 2010. Councillor Toms has asked the PCT to consider an NHS facility on the proposed ALT16 (Barrett Homes) site.

13. CIPFA and the Local Authority Accounting Panel do not accept that a case for introducing a generally applicable minimum level of reserves has been made. Local authorities, on the advice of their chief finance officers, should make their own judgements on such matters taking into account all the relevant local circumstances. Such circumstances vary. A well-managed authority, for example, with a prudent approach to budgeting should be able to operate with a level of general reserves appropriate for the risks (both internal and external) to which it is exposed. In assessing the appropriate level of reserves, a well managed authority will ensure that the reserves are not only adequate but also are necessary. There is a broad range within which authorities might reasonably operate depending on their particular circumstances.

The Council may recall a review of the Station Enquiry Office staffing and functions taking place over the last 10 months. This included consultation with local communities. This process has concluded.

“After careful consideration of the options available and detailed discussions with the Police Authority, the Force has decided to close 34 enquiry offices. As a result, there will be an inevitable reduction in the number of SEO posts in the Force from 119 to 59.”

I have to inform you that it has been decided that Looe will be one of the 59 Station Enquiry Offices to close and the Station Enquiry Officer's post disestablished. Liskeard, the next nearest Station Enquiry Office, is to remain open.

As yet I am unaware of the exact date of closure.

At this stage Police Officers continue to provide a 24 hour service from Looe Police Station.

Looe Town Council report 13th December 2010**Cornwall Council Emergency Budget**

The Emergency Budget was passed. Apart from £100m efficiency savings, an additional savings of £10m from front line services have been identified, although the exact details of which specific front line services are to be cut is unknown at present.

The Cornwall Sports Village (Stadium for Cornwall) capital project was cut from the capital programme. I think members thought that although this is a good idea, it should not receive Council funding not present especially as the feasibility study had not even been published. As mentioned last month, the only light for Looe and area is that the only project in SE Cornwall that will receive revenue funding to work up is Polean Employment Space. If the project pans out we are looking at potentially 150 good quality jobs

Library service

There is a review of the Library service being undertaken. Out of interest the number of visits for Looe Library in 09/10 was 68,853 with a cost per activity of £1.07 and the One Stop Shop had 5572 visits, with cost per activity of £18.67 compare this to another level 3 library say Fowey 41,515 visits costing £2.38 per activity and 4242 costing £19.92 per One Stop Shop activity. Liskeard Library cost more at £1.49 although One Stop Shop was less at £15.04 Although Looe Library compared favourably and not specifically at risk, all are being looked at so please use the Library as usage and footfall will be a determining factor in closure decisions.

We also need to be vigilant over the Public Convenience review which is being undertaken. Cllr Toms and myself are both working hard to retain the approximate £90k earmarked from Caradon District Council for refurbishment and as community network we have collectively made representation to Cllr German.

Traffic regulation order

I met with Cllr Hicks and guest house owners in West Looe last week who are very worried about the 5 minutes observation time for non commercial vehicles. They feel it is damaging their business as guests are having to rush to bring their bags up and check in and some have received parking tickets. This affects residents also.

Mr Hicks was sympathetic but the officer advised that to vary waiting times in different parts of Cornwall would be confusing and difficult to manage. I said that car parks have different charging strategies across Cornwall, who not waiting times? He said that they were very prescribed about the signage they could use to support traffic regulations. The officer felt that the 3 bay loading bay would help as guests could park there without if being blocked by blue badge holders and nothing should be done until this had been tested.

Mr Clements is still not convinced so I have asked Cllr Hicks to ask for a report to be brought to the parking policy Cabinet panel for discussion, which he had agreed to do. He said a report will be prepared as there were similar issues in Padstow and Fowey. I wonder if a blanket 10 minutes waiting time (this is the waiting time for commercial vehicles) could be helpful as there are plenty of other areas in Looe constrained by the geography that need this extra time. Chapel Ground and Hannafore Road come to mind.

Could this Council take the initiative possible by the Mayor directly and appeal to other Mayors in Cornwall with similar difficulties to make representation to Cllr Hicks?

Urgent salt bin Hannafore Road

In the last spate of cold weather there were a number of accidents in the dip by the Pennyland Steps. I asked for a salting from Cornwall Council which they are unable to do as it is outside their responsibilities. I would like to propose that Looe Town Council pays for a salt bin or at

very least a dumpy bag of salt in this location as a matter of urgency as more icy conditions are forecast. This is a notorious frost pocket as it doesn't get the sun at all in Winter and as it's the only route to Hannafore so I believe this is a matter of urgency as there is no salt bin in this location.

South West Water, West Looe

Some traders in West Looe have been having difficulties in claiming compensation from SWW I met with Oliver Denne from SWW this afternoon. He confirms that 8 businesses successfully claimed, many receiving stage payments to help with cash flow. 2 businesses are still in negotiations and having spoken to Mr Denne I am hopefully that an ex gratia payment may be made.

Events & Festivals coordinator

Further to my report last month re funding a part time coordinator and an equipment bank, I have met with the SW Manager of the Heritage Lottery Fund and he was also very keen to support such a post under the Our Heritage measure which has funding up to £50k. We also talked about another project - updating the Heritage Trail with a sculpture trail that could also attract major funding. This project I hope will be led by Looe Development Trust.

Waste initiative

Following the apparent success of the gull proof sacks in Polperro and waste awareness flyer and other measures earlier in the year, I have requested a meeting to evaluate fully this scheme with a view to repeating it in 2011. First reports show that rubbish piled up in Higher market Street are now better protected from gulls and trade waste offenders have been warned. The mess left caused the street cleaners additional work which has minimised since the initiative. I have requested a meeting between Looe Town Council and Lansallos Parish Council, Charlie David and Chris James to plan a similar campaign for next year. Hopefully this can be at the regular cleaning committee.

West Looe Christmas Tree

Finally thanks to Mike Cotton of Hillcrest House Nursing Home for sponsoring the West Looe Xmas Tree and I have arranged a short carol service at the Lantern Procession on 16th by the tree outside St Nicholas Church from 6.15pm. I believe this may be a first for West Looe Quay and hopefully will get people in a festive mood.

Full Council Agenda – Report from Outside Organisations

Deputy Mayor's report to council

On Sunday 5th December I represented the Mayor at the Commissioning Service for the Liskeard and Looe Street Pastors. The service took place in the Liskeard Salvation Army Hall, and was very well attended – with Lisk TC represented by Cllr Anne Purdon, and the police by Inspector Tony Joslin (Lisk and Looe) and members of the Liskeard Neighbourhood Team.

The Street pastors are due to begin night time patrols in Liskeard initially in January. They befriend and give tangible help to people who are at risk in the streets. They work in cooperation with local police officers, who often call them in to assist.

I had previously been updated on the scheme by the Acting Co-ordinator, Ralph Chase, who lives in Looe. Members will recall that LTC are not currently represented on the Steering Group. The local scheme has been formally accredited by the Ascension Trust – the parent organisation – and is in the process of completing a formalisation of their structure. It will greatly assist liaison in Looe if LTC nominates a councillor to sit on the steering group. It is not envisaged that meetings will need to be frequent as the scheme beds-in.

The council will be receiving a request to nominate a representative.
