1. TO RECEIVE QUESTIONS OR STATEMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

A written question had been received from Mr and Mrs Ternan regarding allotments.

The Mayor asked Councillor Toms to respond.

Councillor Toms explained that for two years he had been working to identify suitable land for allotments, two pieces of land had been identified but were not suitable due to the steepness of the land.

Landowners are reluctant to provide land for allotments as the rights of the allotment holders would tie the landowner in thus stopping any potential market value sale of their land.

Councillor Toms had written to the Diocese asking if any part of the Glebe could be made available but that is not possible either.

Councillor Toms reported that Blackendon Farm, Great Trethew does have 5 acres of land available if anyone is willing to travel there and there is also a possibility of some land at Morval.

There being no further questions from the Public the Mayor invited all present to join him for refreshments.
