.1 Isle of Wight Football Championship

The Mayor read out a letter received from the four young men that had been sponsored by Councillors to undertake a five mile walk to raise funds to enable them to take part in the above championship.

.2 Councillor J Dingle - Street Traders

The Mayor read out a letter from Councillor Dingle which expressed concerns over the proliferation of street traders particularly hair-braiders over which there appears to be no hygiene control. A response from Cornwall Council was also read out which appears to pass responsibility to the police.

Councillor Dingle stated that this response is not acceptable and that someone must take responsibility.

Councillor Gregory agreed with Councillor Dingle and stated that this has been an ongoing problem for a number of years and there appears to be no legislation governing this.

Councillor Dingle requested that a letter be sent to our local MP asking her to investigate and that the police should also be contacted. This request was unanimously agreed.

A new play area is being investigated on Sunrising, volunteers are looking at suitable equipment for all ages.

.4 Roads

Numerous roads in Looe need attention and a Local Highways Surveyor has looked at the condition of them all, they will all hopefully be repaired at the end of the summer season.

New Cory refuse collections

I continue to be inundated with complaints about the new recycling and refuse collections. As I write this report at 1pm, refuse in Barbican Hill has still not been collected. (It used to be collected before 8am) I believe that with 6 months to plan the hand over this has been handled very badly.

It is unacceptable for refuse to be collected so late with the inevitable gull attacks. Attached are pics of what happened over Easter in North Road and West Road. The later collections have caused traffic issues and the sea gulls were having a field day. Collections have been missed, some for 2 weeks.

Hannaford Lane didn't have a collection for 2 weeks because they 'could not find them'. Why ever did new operative get put on rounds they had no knowledge of? Why ever did the new service start over Easter?

It also seems they had no idea where the dog bins were or that they were overflowing and after waiting on the phone for 30 minutes and a further 35 minutes while the complaints were logged they were finally emptied. I know Cllrs have also been trying hard to get things resolved.

I impressed upon Cornwall Council and Cory that these practices must be changed as this is damaging to Looe's visitor economy and is frustrating for residents. I have reported all to Cornwall Council.

The new system was highlighted in the Express newspaper this week.

The first para read - A new recycling system has been made so complicated by a council they have had to employ extra staff to explain the rules - yet baffled residents still think they are talking rubbish!

This is not a good image for Cornwall.

I suggest Looe Town Council writes a letter of complaint about the roll out of the service and asks for details of the **minimum service levels** so they can check Cory are complying and recommence the active partnering we had with Cornwall Council which was working well. I would also ask how often dog bins are emptied and who would be the best person to speak to if you have reports of further problems on the ground. Unfortunately I don't consider these to be just teething problems, I believe there is a systemic failure and this new contract has been a retrograde step for some residents in Looe and Polperro. However I will continue to try and make the new contract work for local people and have arranged a number of visits by officers to St Georges Flats and Nailsea Flats to name a few.

The recycling banks changed from SERCO to Cornwall Council at the end of March and have been overflowing ever since. Attached is another pic taken on Saturday. I reported this as fly tipping last week and again on Saturday. **This is not the first sight of Looe we want to give our visitors.**

Looe Polperro and Polruan will be delayed for today because of road resurfacing in Polperro. The hope is all will be cleared by 5pm today.

New tenant information centre opens in Liskeard

A good news story for SE Cornwall is a new Tenants Information and Access Centre at Manley Community Room, Liskeard has opened its doors and is the first in a series of smaller facilities aimed at giving council tenants greater access to information. The new Centre replaces the one which was housed at Trewithan House in Liskeard and is open every Tuesday morning between 10am and 12.30pm. Two computers linked to the internet and a wealth of literature is available to give tenants easy access to information on everything from employment and housing to all sorts of facilities available in their local area. Volunteers are on hand to help and there is information for council tenants who want to know more about Cornwall Housing and Tenant Involvement.

The new centre opened in Liskeard will give council tenants and other local residents access to the internet. Residents will be able to access information on the internet relating to housing, employment opportunities and lots more. We have two more centres opening shortly, one in Saltash and one in Bodmin. We want to roll this out throughout East Cornwall.”

Post 2013 European Structural Funds

I was elected chair of a single issues panel appointed from Economy and Environment Scrutiny panel last Friday which is looking at the lessons learned from Objective One and Convergence, the themes and priorities for Cornwall from 2013 and how best the funding can be governed.

Cornwall had the 2nd largest decline in the whole of Europe with our GDP average from 07, 08, 09 at 72.3% second only to West Wales and are now classed as lesser developed. For context the City of London is 330% and Bulgaria is 27% of average European GDP. This banding will mean an additional £500m for Cornwall plus fisheries and agricultural funding.

The work will carry on through the Summer and look at a range of issues including;

The customer journey. How can all businesses access funding and advice, perhaps with 1 single point of access.

Developing supply chain indicators

How do we achieve the required match funding in the present economic climate

Managing the change from local to National programmes

Joining up capacity between Cornwall Council the local enterprise partnership and business

SE Cornwall specific issues include,

Grow on space for business to ensure we don't lose business to Plymouth

Flexibility in programmes to allow for innovation

Understanding work space availability in east Cornwall.

The overarching European criteria are;

Low carbon economy

Research and Development

Business Competitiveness

Climate Change and Social Inclusion

Minimum Standards of service

I vice chaired a scrutiny session to look at a review of minimum standards for environmental services across Cornwall. This would include whether an area has regional significance, town significance or neighbourhood significance. Minimum standards will be identified and parish and town councils will be able to top up that service.

Service Standards will be developed for:

Inspection Regimes; which will set the frequency of safety inspections Undertaken on the Council's assets, it will determine when the assessment is undertaken, what is classified as a defect and what priority is given to the rectification of any defect found.

Maintenance Standards; which will set the standards for how the Council intends to maintain assets, such as Public Rights of Way, Public Spaces, Beaches, Rivers Streams and Water Courses, Cemeteries and Churchyards etc .

The Environment Service has now collated a comprehensive database of all of the assets it currently manages. This comprises of over 2400 individually named assets. The range of assets included are diverse and vary from parks, play areas, closed churchyards, former mining sites/ engine houses to abandoned quarries and nature reserves.

Parking charges

Cllr Andrew Wallis chair of the parking policy panel will be visiting network areas across Cornwall again in August to look at any changes to parking charges. Indications are that revenue increased in the Millpool car park.

Another good bit of news is that Cornwall Council car parks will be free of charge on 19th May for the Olympic Torch Relay.

Dog poo

I am still getting complaints from people in West Looe about the increasing amount of dog mess left on the streets. It's particularly bad in Hannafore Lane, Hannafore Beach, Pennyland and West Looe Hill.

I continue to distribute the Cornwall Council Scoop the Poop campaign posters around West Looe and have asked for an additional supply of the official signage to be put on lamp posts. I urge people to report when they see owners who allow their dogs to foul. A publicised prosecution might make people more aware of their responsibilities. The fine is up to £1000 or an on the spot fine of £80 The Community Officer can't come too soon!

Walking Routes

The West Looe part of the Pod cast was recorded on 13th March by Kernow Pod Casts. I have written all the scripts for East Looe and this will be recorded on 8th May. The sign designs are nearly ready for approval by the Council. I would be grateful if the Council can approve the designer to start work on the illustrative map as a first step.

West Looe Business Community

The west Looe traders have renamed themselves to West Looe Business Community.

Main points of note;

- Jewson have given west Looe businesses group members a 10% discount card
- Promotion starts for the Design a Crown for the Queen competition
- Businesses are running the 'What's out of place in my window' competition again for May Fayre

Their newsletter is attached. The next meeting is 6pm 24th April in Jolly Sailor

West Looe May Fayre

Plans are just about complete. I would be grateful for assistance from Councillors particularly for the processional from 10.15am.

29 stalls are planned with May Pole Dancing at 2 slots during the day.

There is a full programme of entertainment throughout the day and an advertising programme. An advert has been donated for Looe Town Council in recognition of their assistance in acting as treasurer.

Tescos

I have been briefed by Tescos today who have tried to address a number of the issues raised by objectors and the Town Council. Out of 660 responses only 13% objected to the plans with 80% in favour.

260 of the respondents shopped exclusively in Liskeard with only 13 people doing all their weekly shopping in Looe.

The main change seems that the houses are now 100% affordable and will be managed by Hastoe and Aster Housing. The mix will be 4 bed roomed and 1 bed roomed which seems to be the requirement in Looe. The preference for the community use from the feedback is football club facilities, youth centre and skateboard park.

The access at St Martins is likely to be a roundabout despite the consultants saying the existing access is OK.

The approach road will have sleeping policemen, be 20mph limit with flashing signs and a lights controlled pedestrian crossing, all of which Tescos say will help slow traffic nearing the school. An additional 40 spaces for staff parking for the school has been designed with an improved coach and bus drop off in the school car park.

The application is likely to be submitted by mid May and hopefully will come to strategic planning in Aug/Sept for consideration.

Looe Music Festival

The committee is almost ready to announce their headliners for 2012 and a new website has been launched. Huge thanks to all who volunteered for a pelting on the seafront, especially The Mayor who all agreed was a great sport.
