



Looe Community Academy Report for Looe Town Council

1. All of our Year 7 students will participated in STEMfest 2019 on Monday 16 September. This is an event run by the National Marine Aquarium in partnership with Princess Yachts, a British luxury yacht manufacturer based in Plymouth. This is an opportunity for students to get hands on with the Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.
2. We welcomed our MP Sheryll Murray on Friday 20 September to speak to students about the issues around climate change. Students have also formed an Eco Committee to help to make the school a more environmentally friendly place.
3. Students from Miss Oldham's Year 9 English class saw their work published in the book 'Mission Contamination' recently. After entering a 'Young Writers' competition, their mini-sagas were chosen to be published and they will now be entered into a draw with a possible first prize of £1,000.
4. We have once again competed in a Bar Mock Trial competition where we won two out of our three cases. The Bar Mock Trial Competition, run in partnership with the Bar Council, gives young people an exciting insight into the workings of the legal system. It de-mystifies the justice system for young people, giving them the knowledge, skills and confidence to be legally capable.
5. Over the past two weeks, Year 11 students have been sitting their GCSE mock exams in preparation for the summer. They will also participate in 'mock interviews' this coming week to help them in the future.
6. Some of our students participated in the UK Mathematics Trust, Senior Team Maths Challenge at Coombe Dean School in Plymouth last week.
7. The science department ran a STEM workshops recently for pupils from feeder primary schools. The Year six students and teachers had an amazing time and there were so many positive comments about joining the Academy next year. There was a real buzz of inspiration, motivation and excitement in every room!
8. For Remembrance this year, we held a special assembly and were joined by Mr Portman from the Royal British Legion. We laid a wreath at the memorial in Looe on the Sunday and George Quint played The Last Post at the service in Looe on the Monday.
9. On Tuesday this week we welcome representatives from Looe Town Council to talk to the students about their youth engagement initiative 'Youth4Looe'.
10. The Academy once again supported Children in Need by holding a Mufti day.
11. This Friday, 29 November, we are holding a Prom Fashion Show at 7pm. We are raising money towards the Prom for the Class of 2020. Tickets are now on sale.
