This meeting I would like to inform Councillors about my ward as every year I check how the area is doing via the indices of Multiple Deprivation. Whilst the Central part of my ward the deprivation has decreased the North and East area remains in the top 20% of deprivation nationally. This map shows the area.



From the information in the report and having seen previous reports that the age range of the population in the Central part has decreased slightly. With the number of people 50 plus increasing which will have effects on schools, health services and employable people. This table shows the numbers via 5 year age groups.

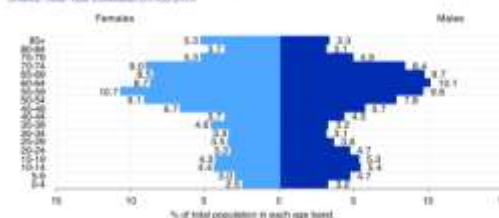
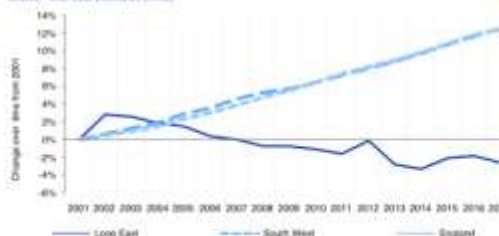


Figure: Population by age
