Only last week Looe Town Council launched the ‘Looe Community Cupboard’ and I am happy to report that the cupboard is not only being used effectively but that we have received over £1000 from two anonymous donors to ensure that it is kept stocked with essentials for families in Looe. My heartfelt thanks go to you for your benevolence and belief in the community.

Many of you will be wondering about the large Marquee which is now situated in the patient's car park beside the Doctor's surgery. It is a ‘drive through’ station for routine blood tests to ensure the most vulnerable patients are protected. My thanks go to Jason Bond, Plymouth Argyle Football Club and the team at Looe Town Council for supporting the Old Bridge Street Surgery for this potentially lifesaving facility.

**We are asking residents to help us to ensure that their neighbours are safe** and receiving the support they need. We now call every person registered for support on at least a weekly basis. If you would like to check if your neighbour or family member is registered, or if you would like to let us know about someone you feel may be vulnerable please call **01503 804099**.
