

## Highway improvement scheme • January 2023

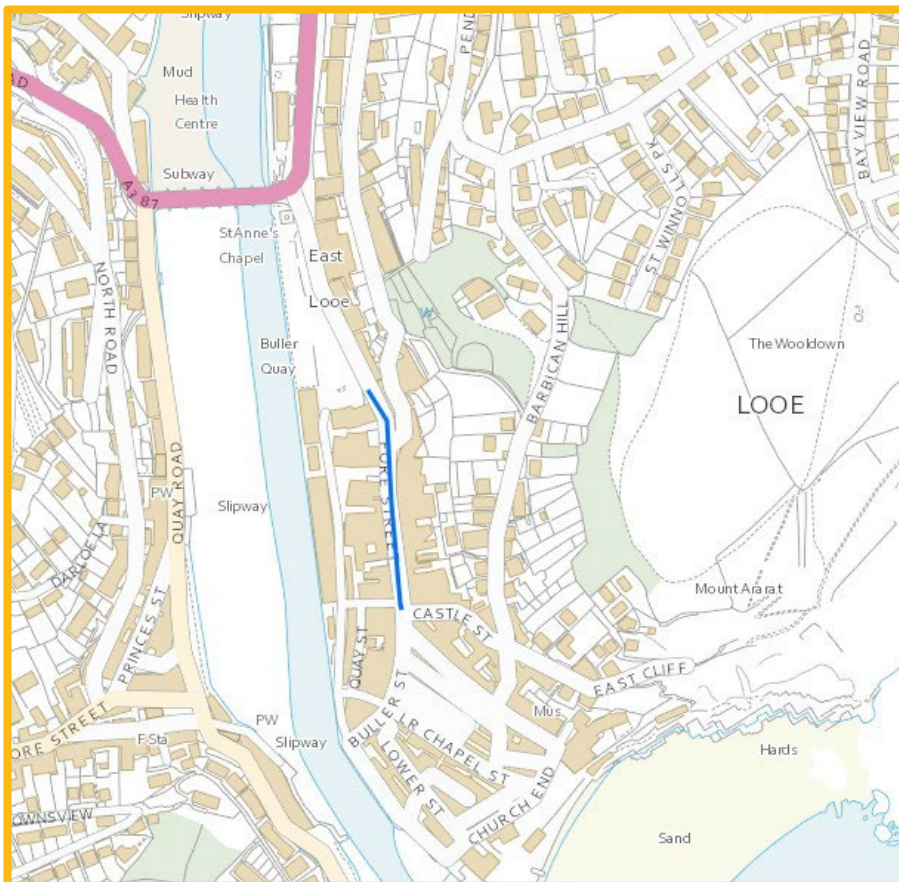
### Looe drainage works

As part of our planned drainage improvement works, traffic management will be in place on Fore Street from Monday 9<sup>th</sup> January to Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January. Then from Monday 30<sup>th</sup> January to Friday 17<sup>th</sup> February, while civil engineering works take place.

To reduce disruption we will operate a ‘give and take’ traffic management system. This means we will close off one side of the road, tapering traffic into single file and road users will pass at their discretion when the road is clear.

We will then need implement road closures as we progress through the scheme due to width restrictions. Two-way traffic lights will be in operation on Barbican Hill to facilitate the closure. They will be manually operated to assist in keeping traffic moving . The road closure will be lifted after each day to minimise the impact on the local community. All through traffic will need to follow the diversions in place at all times.

Works will be carried out during the day between the hours of **8.00am and 5.00pm, Monday to Friday.**

## What works are taking place?

Our works will involve excavation and removal of an existing slot channel drain. We will also replace the gully covers and carry out repairs to defective sections of kerbing and stone block paving along this section of the highway.

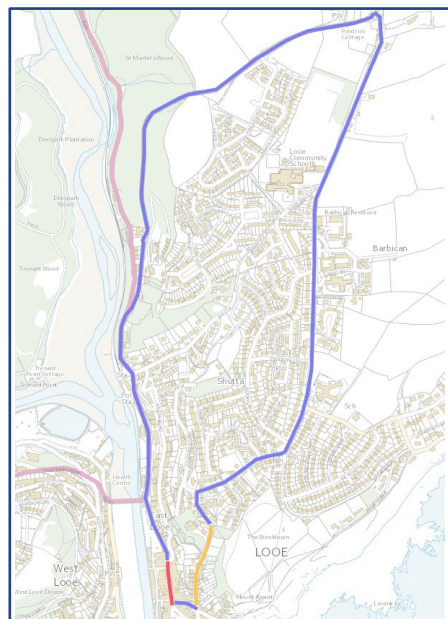
These improvements will aim to reduce the frequency of maintenance works on the drainage system and ensure the safety of road users and the local community.

Works will be carried out in two phases. Starting on 9<sup>th</sup> January we will carry out works using a give and take traffic management system. Phase two will start on 30<sup>th</sup> January and will involve a road closure. We will be working in a narrow section on Fore Street and will need to close it to give our workforce a safe working zone.

Please be aware we need to allow enough time for the materials to cure and gain strength before the area can be driven over by traffic.

We understand road closures can be frustrating but we need to implement these measures.

## Diversions

Signs will be placed at major junctions prior to the road closures on the key routes to take non-through traffic away and keep traffic disruption to a minimum.

Diversion routes can sometimes be quite lengthy but they have to be suitable for the type of traffic that would normally use the route.

## Access arrangements

Access will be maintained throughout phase 1 but road users may experience short delays.

During phase two we will do our best to accommodate the requirements of people directly impacted by the road closure. Access will be maintained for deliveries in the morning prior to 8.00am and again in the evening after 5.00pm.

Emergency access will be maintained at all times.

## Working safely

We encourage drivers to keep to the speed limits and follow the appropriate signage to ensure the safety of those working on site and fellow road users.

Please be kind to the workforce. All our sites will be appropriately risk assessed and have strict safeguarding measures in line with current health and safety and Public Health England guidance to ensure the safety of residents and our staff.

## Notifications

Our work is often weather dependent and can be delayed by heavy rain.

If this situation arises, we will do our best to update the advance notice boards on the site.
