Services, Assets and Community Committee met on the 21st October 2024

Resolutions

Double Waste Bin Goonwartha/Tregarrick Junction	It was RESOLVED that this bin should be stored until a suitable location and need can be identified.
Future of Community Cupboard	It was RESOLVED to offer the cupboard to Looe Shedders.
Replacement of Seafont Urinals	It was RESOLVED to appoint G J Plumbing to remove the urinals and install a trough.
Procurement of Flood Barrier for Library and Community Hub	It was RESOLVED to order the flood barrier from Flood Protection Solutions and to agree via email a supplier for its installation.
Permit Holders of the Patients Car Park and Charges for Rental Units	It was RESOLVED to recommend to Full Council an annual increase of 3% (£6) for permit holders of the patients car park and no increase in annual charges for rental units.

Recommendations

Millpool and Seafont Toilets	It was agreed to research comparator information from other Cornish towns about toilet charges and to enquire about a pre-loaded toilet card.

Millpool and Seafont Toilets

The Council have enquired about the possibility of a toilet card that can be sold to users of the Millpool and Seafont toilets. The Deputy Clerk has contacted Hi-Tech Washroom Solutions and we are waiting on a response.

Effectively, rather than uses with a monthly reload – We have enquired about the possibility of setting the card to have a certain amount, which is only reloaded when someone tops the credit up. It was felt that this could benefit families, meaning that children could use the toilets without needing to use their parents bank cards. We have asked how this could be administered – would Hi-Tech or staff at the Community Hub need to credit the cards. Hi-Tech will investigate the possibility further and update the Council at the next meeting of the Services Assets and Community Committee.

Mariners Garden	We will progress to cost the Mariners Garden on the basis that this will be funded using Community Investment Levy funds.
