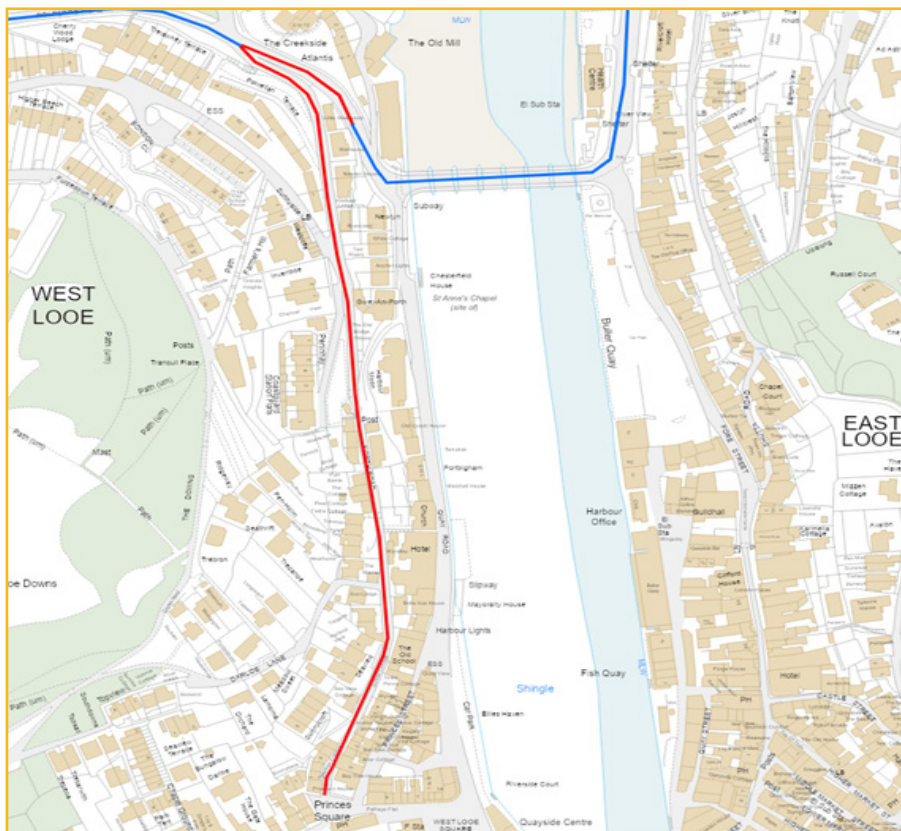
# A387, Polperro Road, West Looe

Following a landslide on the A387 in West Looe earlier in the year and subsequent work by Cormac’s highways teams to make the area safe and enable the road to reopen for two-way traffic, we can now inform you about the next phase of work, which is to carry out essential safety work to prevent further collapse of the retaining wall on Polperro Road.

To enable the work to take place and keep road users and the workforce safe, road closures will be necessary. Polperro Road will be closed from Monday 4 November to Friday 20 December.

To meet the project deadline, work will need to be carried out during the day and into the evening from Monday to Friday, with the possibility of working on weekends where required. Our working times will be from 7.30am to 11pm.

Please be aware that work to repair the retaining wall behind In Lieu on North Road has started. This project is being carried out simultaneously with the work on Polperro Road, and for this reason, North Road will also be closed to traffic for the same duration.

## Why are we doing this work?

We need to protect and stabilise the slope from any further deterioration and keep carriageway in a safe and serviceable condition, open to traffic.

## What works are taking place?

Soil nails will be drilled and grouted into the slope to stabilise it. A geotechnical mesh will then be installed to support the surface of the slope. Localised repairs to the retaining wall will follow to complete the scheme.

Similar to the work on North Road, there is likely to be moderate noise from the construction activities. We will use our best efforts to reduce noise levels wherever possible, and apologise in advance for any disturbance.

## Diversions

Signs will be placed at major junctions prior to the road closure on the key routes to take non-through traffic away and keep traffic disruption to a minimum.

Two-way traffic lights will be installed along Quay Road and Looe Bridge to help ensure effective traffic flow in the area.

## Access arrangements

Access for the school bus services will be maintained from Monday to Friday during the following times:

- 7.30am - 8.30am
- 3.15pm - 3.45pm
- 5.30pm - 6.00pm

Emergency access will be maintained between 7.30am and 11pm, while the workforce is on site.

Only access into the road to Millpool Cottages from Bridgend will be permitted, and 'businesses open as usual' signage will be in place at Bridgend.

Our work sites can be dangerous places. Please do not enter the working areas. This is restricted to authorised personnel only.

For everyone's safety, all instructions and signage must be followed.

## Notifications

The timetable for works of this nature can be subject to the unpredictable influences of weather.
